## CVOR Workshop

### PURPOSE

In order to do business and stay in business in Ontario, commercial carriers must understand and maintain conditions set out by their Commercial Vehicle Operating Registration (CVOR). This practical workshop details how CVOR holders can identify their responsibilities and performance levels under the province's carrier monitoring and audit process. Participants will develop an understanding of audit procedures, the safety rating process, and how to use a CVOR as a tool to identify and correct operational problems.

This workshop looks in-depth at the carrier monitoring process, building on the knowledge and experience gained through the Fleet Driver Trainer Course. It is designed specifically for those who hold, are responsible for maintaining or monitor a CVOR, including carriers, safety directors, trainers, auditors and insurance personnel. Professionals from other industries will also find it a valuable tool in dealing with commercial safety and regulatory compliance issues.

### PROCESS

- Understand the purpose of the CVOR and how Ontario's carrier monitoring system operates;
- Identify privileges and responsibilities set out through the CVOR;
- Analyze a CVOR and derive essential carrier compliance information;
- Recognize the effect that a carrier's level of safety and compliance has on its operating record, safety rating, and ultimately its operating privileges;
- Identify some key strategies for maintaining a satisfactory operating record;
- Participants may bring their own CVOR for use in the workshop sessions.

FORMAT	Classroom-Interactive workshop; formal instruction, discussion and practical exercises.
DURATION	One (1) day
PARTICIPANTS	Fifteen (15) maximum
FACILITIES	Classroom or boardroom supplied by company
WRAP UP	A wrap-up meeting involving the company and the OSL Facilitator is desirable as it provides an opportunity to discuss overall driver test results, attitudes and consequent development strategies for consideration.
